Re: The New Jersey Campaign Control and Expenditures Reporting Act ("the Act") Your Letter Dated July 20, 1973

Dear Mr. Coyle:

Your letter of July 20, 1973, to the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission ("the Commission"), including a request for advisory opinion, has been forwarded to me for reply. By previous correspondence, the Commission requested an extension of time within which to reply to August 20, 1973.

- 1. In the opinion of the Commission your committee constitutes a municipal committee of a political party, and as such is required to make a report respecting all contributions and expenditures from April 24, 1973, the effective date of the Act until July 24, 1973 (or stating that no such contributions or expenditures occurred). On the facts set forth in your letter, your committee is not required to file any report as to contributions or expenditures on behalf of the candidate referred to in your letter.
- 2. Your committee will be required to file reports 25 and 7 days before the election and 15 days after the election, setting forth contributions and expenditures (or stating that no such contributions or expenditures occurred). The local candidate will, of course, have the obligation to file the report (or affidavit) called for by the Act.

4. Forms for the required reports will be provided by the Commission as soon as possible.

Dear Mr. Reiche:

I am the Municipal Chairman of the duly elected Democratic County Committee of Hanover Township. This committee is not actively engaged in fund-raising of any type to further the election of any candidate or influence any legislation. Each candidate in our Township, where we are the minority party, generally runs his own local campaign.

I would appreciate receiving an advisory opinion to guide us on the following issues regarded by the new Election Disclosure Act:

- Since no money has been raised or spent; are any reports required from this Municipal Committee in relation to the past primary election. The one local Democratic Candidate has already filed an Affidavit with the County Clerk that no money in excess of \$1000.00 was spent on his behalf by any person or committee.
- 2. Since no money will be raised or spent in the November Election by this Municipal Committee is the committee nevertheless still required to file reports 25 and 7 days before the election and 15 days after, even though the local candidate himself will of course file those reports.
- 3. Must such an inactive Municipal Committee file any annual reports or appoint a depository bank even if no funds will be raised or spent by this Municipal Committee, on behalf of the local candidate.
