PRESS RELEASE

According to figures released today, campaign spending by incumbents was more than twice the amount spent by challengers for the Primary, 1991 legislative races. The figures released were based upon the Primary, 1991 20-day postelection reports.

"The advantage that incumbents enjoy in communicating with the voters is clear," said Frederick M. Herrmann, Executive Director of the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission (ELEC), "made all the more so by the fact that the percentage of total funds spent by incumbents has risen dramatically since 1987, the last time both the Senate and the General Assembly were up for election." In that year, incumbents spent 51 percent of the total funds expended; in 1991, incumbents spent 70 percent of the total amount.

"These figures demonstrate that challengers had much greater difficulty than incumbents in getting their messages to the voters -- a situation which is not good for competitive, democratic government," said Herrmann.

"ELEC has been supporting the imposition of contribution limits to make challengers more viable and to remove the appearance of undue influence being placed upon all candidates," remarked Herrmann.

Since 1987, spending by incumbents rose 63 percent. In 1987, incumbents from both Houses spent \$1,000,234; in 1991, that figure rose to \$1,626,952. Spending by Assembly incumbents compared with Assembly challengers and Senate incumbents and challengers saw the largest increase over 1987 figures, increasing by 93 percent. The incumbent candidates for the General Assembly spent \$490,718 in 1987 and \$946,916 in 1991. Spending by incumbent Senate candidates rose 33 percent from 1987, \$509,516 to \$680,036.

Challengers, on the other hand, spent 26 percent less in 1991 than in 1987, going from \$954,964 in 1987 to \$706,490 in 1991. Challengers spent only 30 percent of all the funds expended in 1991, down from 49 percent four years ago.

Fundraising by incumbents overall jumped 11 percent since 1987, going from \$2,086,197 to \$2,316,990. However, when breaking down the incumbent candidates by their candidacy for the Senate and General Assembly, fundraising by incumbent Assembly candidates rose 26 percent, while the incumbent Senate candidate fundraising declined by 5 percent.

Meanwhile, fundraising by challengers continued to decline. "It is probably more difficult because of the recession for candidates to raise money in 1991 than in 1987, a situation which impacts harder on challengers than incumbents," Herrmann remarked. Challengers raised 27 percent less in 1991. The dollar amounts for fundraising went from \$1,192,828 in 1987 to \$865,297 in 1991.

In all, only 28 percent of the funds raised were raised by challengers. This figure is down from 36 percent of the funds raised in 1987.

Interestingly, overall fundraising declined since 1987 by 3 percent, going from \$3,279,025 in 1987 to \$3,182,287 in 1991. "This decrease in overall fundraising is probably related to the current economic downturn in New Jersey," speculated Herrmann.

It should be noted that the Commission has the ability to arrange the data in various other formats upon request.

Only those statistical information sheets submitted by 5:00 p.m. on July 12, 1991, are a part of this release. If a candidate or treasurer failed to submit a statistical information sheet, the staff of ELEC used the report filed by 5:00 p.m. on July 12th to determine financial activity.

Although the Commission has taken all reasonable precautions to prevent mathematical or typographical errors, the possibility that some exist cannot be entirely eliminated. Copies of any report on file with the Commission are available for inspection during regular office hours.

Also, please be reminded that candidates and committees may transfer funds among each other. Although these transfers are counted in ELEC's statistics as receipts and expenditures, they are not transactions which create new funds. Nevertheless, ELEC's figures create a useful indicator of overall fundraising and spending in the 1991 Primary Election.
