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### PREFACE

This report concerns contributions and expenditures in the 1983 New Jersey Legislative Election. The report is presented in two volumes. Volume 1 presents general information summarizing campaign financial activity occurring during the election. Volume 2 presents a summary of each candidate's financial activity.

The principal research for and work on this report was done by R. David Rousseau who also supervised the manual assembly of data. William R. Schmidt and he wrote the text and oversaw report production. Celia Minich and Donna Matlock were the principal support staff assisted by Carol Killings and Sandra Magee.

The staff who manually assembled the data for the candidate information sheets (Volume 2) were: Sheila Becker, John Hulick, Larry Hopkins, Maria Kupczak and Carmelo Russo.

In recognition of the collective efforts of the staff, listed below are those individuals who, as present or former staff members, directly contributed to the completion of this report.

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## INTRODUCTION

In November 1983, New Jersey elected a new Legislature in the most expensive general election legislative campaign since financial disclosure requirements were enacted in 1973. Candidates and committees spent \$5.5 million and the two state political party committees spent an additional \$2.7 million, chiefly for legislative races. This total of \$8.25 million is approximately \$250,000 more than the \$7.98 million spent in 1981, the last time both houses of the Legislature were elected.

This report has been prepared by the Election Law Enforcement Commission in furtherance of the statutory mandate that the Commission provide summary information of campaign financial activity; see N.J.S.A. 19:44A-6. This report has been published in two volumes. Volume 1 contains general data on the 1983 legislative campaigns. Section I provides general information on candidates including the districts in which they ran, their political party affiliation, their incumbency status, and the results of their elections. Section II of this volume provides summary information on the total expenditures for each legislative candidate as well as the total cost per race in each legislative district. Comparative figures are provided for the total expenditures of the 1983, 1981, 1979 and 1977 Assembly races and the 1983, 1981 and 1977 Senate races.

In Section III, the report summarizes contribution information by type of contributor and by selected dollar amounts of contributions. In Section IV, information is provided on political action committees, on the amount of funds they donated to each candidate, and on the aggregate amount distributed by each committee. Major contributors to the individual legislative campaigns and to the two state political party committees are identified in Section V, along with the total dollar amount given by the contributor. These aggregate contributor summaries identify individuals, businesses, unions (grouped in categories) and a miscellaneous group. All these entities donated funds in excess of \$2,500 to legislative races.

Volume 2 of this 1983 Legislative election summary contains individual summary information sheets for each legislative candidate who filed detailed disclosure reports, Form R-1.

The information in this report is taken from disclosure statements filed by candidates and their supporting committees. "The New Jersey Campaign Contributions and Expenditures Reporting Act" (Campaign Reporting Act, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-1 et seq.), enacted in 1973, provides a system of uniform disclosure of campaign financial information. The disclosure requirements extend to all candidates for State, county, and municipal office, as well as campaign committees and political party committees and clubs. The Campaign Reporting Act requires the disclosure of the name and address of each contributor of more than \$100 in the aggregate. This requirement exists regardless of the amount of money expended on behalf of the candidate's campaign.

Additionally, those candidates expending more than \$1,000 (raised to \$2,000 in 1984) must report all expenditures and the total aggregate amount of contributions received. All candidates must file either the detailed disclosure report (Form R-1) or the Sworn Statement in lieu of report (Form A-1) as of the 25th day before the election. Those candidates filing the detailed Form R-1 must supplement this information 7 days before the election, 15 days after the election, and every 60 days thereafter until such time when they can submit a final report which accounts for any unexpended balance and disposes of all outstanding obligations. (In January 1984, the reporting dates were changed to

29 days and 11 days before the election, 20 days after the election and every 60 days thereafter.) Unless otherwise stated, the financial data in this report include only that activity reported as of the 15 day postelection filing, covering the campaign activity from the inception of the general election campaign through November 22, 1983. Information filed by candidates and committees concerning activity since that time is available for public review at the Commission's office.

This report deals specifically with the 1983 general election for the offices of State Senator and State Assembly. The data have been organized in a consistent format to make it easier for the reader to make comparisons among candidates. Furthermore, the report extracts key elements (for example, the type of contributor) also for the purpose of making it easier for the reader to make comparisons and reach conclusions.

In preparing this report, the Commission has not attempted to interpret data. Rather, the information has been compiled as a reference source to assist the user in obtaining information concerning the 1983 legislative campaigns.

#### CANDIDATE INFORMATION SHEET - METHODOLOGY AND DATA COLLECTION

Data referenced throughout this report are the accumulation of financial information gathered for each legislative candidate who filed detailed disclosure reports for the 1983 general election. An individual summary information sheet for each of these candidates is in Volume 2 of this report. Nevertheless, in order for the reader to have an accurate understanding of the information provided within this report, a sample of the summary information sheet and an outline of the procedures used to collect and present this financial information are provided here in Volume 1.

A sample of the candidate summary can be found at the conclusion of this section. The summary begins with the left section of the two-part page. It identifies the candidate by full name, office sought, legislative district number, party affiliation, incumbency status, and election result. (Tables 1.1 through 1.4 in Section I identify the Senate and Assembly candidates both by district number and alphabetically.) The second section of the summary sheet identifies the candidate's supporting committees. The supporting committees are essential to understanding the method used in compiling a candidate's financial data. In many instances, a candidate is supported by committees in addition to, or other than, his or her personal campaign fund. Candidates often pool resources with others of the same party in addition to, or in lieu of, a single candidate depository. The extent to which a candidate controls all or part of the financial activity varies. Therefore, to insure an overall view of the candidate's total campaign activity, the financial data of all of the candidate's related committees were merged under a single candidate listing. The supporting committees' contributions and expenditures were prorated to the individual candidate based on the identified candidate's proportion shown as an allocation of expenditures made on the candidate's behalf by the supporting committee and reflected in the committee's campaign financial reports.

In its disclosure reports, a committee identifies the candidates it has supported and the amount the committee expended on behalf of each candidate. Based on this allocation, the percentage of the committee's activity related to

the individual candidate was calculated and prorated to the individual candidates for both the committee's expenditures (disbursements and outstanding obligations) and the committee's receipts. For example, the Committee to Elect XYZ allocates 30 percent of all expenditures to candidate Y. When the Committee to Elect XYZ receives a \$1,000 contribution from John Smith, 30 percent of that contribution is attributed to candidate Y. Therefore, contributor Smith appears, in this report, as a contributor to candidate Y's campaign in the amount of \$300 (30 percent of the \$1,000 contribution). The information summary sheets presented in Volume 2 of this report identify the supporting committees whose financial data are merged with the individual candidate's campaign fund. They also identify the percent of the committees' transactions attributed to the candidate. In Section I of Volume 1, Table 1.10 identifies supporting committees for each candidate, other than the candidate's individual campaign depository.

#### Table A. Receipts

Table A, Receipts, on the left hand side of the information sheet, summarizes the dollar amounts of receipts which include contributions, transfers, and loans. Contributions are listed in two categories: monetary contributions (Line 1) and in-kind contributions (Line 2). Monetary contributions are funds in the form of cash, check, and money orders. In-kind contributions represent the fair market value of a tangible item or paid personal service supplied to the campaign without cost. Examples of in-kind contributions include donated office space to be used as headquarters, billboard space owned by a contributor, and the services of a secretary who works on behalf of the candidate's campaign and whose employer continues to pay the secretary's salary. Uncompensated volunteer services are not in-kind contributions. The value of an allocation of expenditures made on behalf of the candidate by committees other than those previously identified as supporting committees are also included as part of the amount for in-kind contributions with the exception of allocations from a state political party committee. State political party committee allocations are separately identified (Line 3) and, when added to monetary and in-kind contributions, result in total contributions (Line 4) to the candidate.

A candidate's campaign funds left over from prior elections and transferred to the 1983 general election are identified as prior election transfers (Line 5).

Outstanding loans (Line 6) are considered receipts to the campaign until such time that they are repaid. Often loans still outstanding at the end of the campaign are forgiven and converted into contributions. Therefore, loans are not included in the contributor tables which follow.

Total receipts (Line 7) is the sum of total contributions (Line 4), prior election transfers (Line 5), and outstanding loans (Line 6).

#### Table B. Expenditures and Debt

Table B, Expenditures and Debt, on the left-hand side of the page, is a summary of the candidate's campaign expenditures. These include all payments actually disbursed (Line 1) and any outstanding obligations incurred, but not yet paid, by the campaign as of November 22, 1983 (Line 2). The total



indebtedness (Line 9) of the campaign is made up of outstanding obligations (Line 2) and any loans outstanding (Line 8) as of the 15-day postelection filing. The total reported cost of the campaign without the state political party committee allocation (Line 5) is made up of the expenditures made by the supporting committees (Line 3), plus the in-kind contributions (Line 4), which represent disbursements made on the candidate's behalf outside of the campaign depositories.

The total expended on behalf of the candidate (Line 7) is the sum of Line 5 (the total expended without the state political party allocation) and the state political party committee allocation (Line 6).

Also shown is the campaign cost per vote which was calculated in two different ways: first using the total expended without the state committee (Line 5) and second using the total including the state committee allocation (Line 7). The first entry identifies the campaign cost per registered voter in the legislative district (Line 10 and Line 12). The second entry identifies the campaign cost per actual number of votes received by the candidate (Line 11 and Line 13).

#### Table C. Surplus Campaign Funds

Table C, Surplus Campaign Funds, at the bottom of the left-hand side of the page, shows the amount of surplus campaign funds available as of the closing date of the 15-day postelection report, November 22, 1983. The cash balance on hand of the candidate's campaign fund and the cash balance of the supporting committees is combined (Line 1). The amount of any surplus campaign funds must be viewed in conjunction with outstanding obligations or gross debt (Line 2) to determine whether these surplus funds, in whole or in part, are available for obligations yet unpaid. Thus, the reported amount of cash on hand (Line 1) is a gross amount that must be compared to the amount of outstanding obligations or debt (Line 2) to arrive at the net surplus funds, if any (Line 3). For those candidates whose gross debt is greater than their cash on hand, a zero has been entered as net surplus funds (Line 3).

#### Table D. Number and Amount of Itemized Contributions by Contributor Amount

Table D, Number and Amount of Itemized Contributions by Contributor Amount, (upper portion of the right side of the page) provides data by selected contribution amounts. For each selected contribution amount category, the table lists the number and percentage of itemized contributions and the dollar amount and percentage of itemized contributions in each category. Under the law, reporting candidates and committees need not report the names of contributors whose contributions aggregate \$100 or less; they need only report the total amount of such contributions received during the reporting period. They are also not required to report the number of such entries. However, some candidates do report such contributions of \$100 or less; furthermore, when apportioning a contribution given to a committee supporting more than one candidate, the amount apportioned to a single candidate may result in an amount of less than \$100. Therefore, in calculating percentages, only itemized contributions were used, i.e. contributions over \$100, plus any contributions of less than \$100 that were also itemized.

Table E. Number and Amount of  
Itemized Contributions by Contributor Type

Table E, Number and Amount of Itemized Contributions by Contributor Type (middle of the right side of the page), provides data on contributions by the type of contributor. The table segregates the candidate's personal funds from other individual contributors to avoid distorting the average contribution from individuals. When a candidate uses his or her personal funds, the amount is usually much larger than the average individual contribution. Business contributors include both corporate and noncorporate entities. Political committees are grouped separately as political party committees and as other political committees, which includes clubs, other campaign funds, and groups established for the purpose of influencing the outcome of the election. Political action committees (PACs) are separated into three categories: business PACs, union PACs, and other PACs. New Jersey Law does not provide a precise definition of a political action committee; for this analysis a PAC is considered to be any political committee which calls itself a PAC or functions as a PAC by separately reporting its financial activity as a noncandidate-related political committee. Business-related PACs are those associated with a specific trade, profession, or industry. Union PACs are those committees associated with a specific labor union or union locals. Other PACs are, in most cases, ideological groups that represent a specific philosophy or issue. Union contributors are entities which give funds from the general treasury of a union organization or a specific union local and not through a separate political fund. The final category, miscellaneous, represents those contributors that clearly do not belong in any of the other categories and includes interest earned from the investment of contributions.

Table E, Number and Amount of Itemized Contributions by Contributor Type, classifies all contributions that were itemized (both those in amounts of more than \$100 and those of \$100 and less) into contributor-type categories and identifies the number of contributions, the total amount contributed, and the average contribution by each contributor type.

Table F. Amount of Receipts by Receipt Type

Table F, Amount of Receipts by Receipt Type, classifies receipts into five principal types: (1) itemized contributions, (2) unitemized contributions of \$100 or less, (3) prior election transfers, (4) loans outstanding, and (5) state political party committee allocations. The amount for each and the percentage of total receipts each represents are provided in Table F.

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Please Note: An alphabetical listing of contributors of more than \$100 by name and address for each individual candidate and committee is published by the Commission and is available for inspection and purchase. An alphabetical listing by contributor name is also available.

## SECTION I

### GENERAL CANDIDATE INFORMATION

In the 1983 general election, there were 260 candidates, of whom 88 vied for 40 Senate seats and 172 vied for 80 Assembly seats. Of these 260 candidates, 120 represented the Democratic party, 120 represented the Republican party, and 20 represented other parties or were Independent candidates. This section contains tables of basic information about the individuals participating in the 1983 legislative races. Each set of data is presented separately for Senate and Assembly candidates. Table 1.1 for Senate candidates and Table 1.2 for Assembly candidates identify the candidates based on their legislative district number and group the candidates alphabetically within each district. Since most of the tables and information throughout this report are organized by legislative district number, Tables 1.1 and 1.2 enable the reader to identify each candidate and each candidate's district number. The 1980 census and the resulting redistricting of legislative boundaries have altered some familiar combinations of representatives and districts; for example, the legislative district number may have changed while the municipalities which comprised the district remained relatively unaltered or the number may have remained the same while the municipalities changed. Hence, these listings, together with Tables 1.3 (Senate) and 1.4 (Assembly) which list the candidates in alphabetical order regardless of legislative district number, will aid the reader in overcoming the confusion that may result from changes brought about by redistricting.

These four tables of Senate candidates and Assembly candidates identify the candidates by full name, district number, party affiliation, and incumbency status, that is, whether the candidate was an incumbent or a challenger, or whether the election involved an open seat. The tables also indicate whether the candidates were successful in their campaigns.

This section also contains four additional tables of information not directly related to the candidates' campaign financial activity. Table 1.5 is a list of members of the Legislature who did not run for reelection. Table 1.6 identifies the 1983 Senate member who ran for an Assembly seat and Table 1.7 is a list of the Assembly members who ran for Senate seats in the 1983 election. Table 1.8 identifies the 21 New Jersey counties and the 40 legislative districts in which they fall.

Table 1.9 lists those legislative candidates who submitted a Sworn Statement in lieu of report (Form A-1) stating that expenditures on behalf of their candidacies would not exceed \$1,000. Allocations of expenditures on behalf of candidates by the candidates' state political party committees were not considered in determining this \$1,000 threshold. The candidates listed on this table were not included in calculating the averages appearing throughout this report since it is not possible to determine where in the range of \$0 to \$1,000 the candidates' campaign expenditures fall. Therefore, all averages refer to the average dollar amount expended by those 81 out of 88 Senate candidates and 152 out of 172 Assembly candidates whose expenditures exceeded \$1,000 for this election.

Table 1.10 contains information concerning a candidate's supporting committee(s) which is essential to understanding the method used in compiling individual candidate financial information throughout this report. In many instances, a candidate is supported by campaign committees in addition to, or other than, his or her personal campaign fund. Candidates often pool resources with others of the same party in addition to, or in lieu of, a single candidate depository. The extent to which a candidate controls all or part of the

financial activity varies. Therefore, to insure an overall view of a candidate's total campaign activity, the financial data of all the candidate's related committees were merged under a single candidate listing. The supporting committees' contributions and expenditures were prorated to the individual candidate based on the identified proportion shown as an allocation of expenditures made on the candidate's behalf by the supporting committees in the committees' separate campaign disclosure reports. Therefore, Table 1.10 identifies the supporting committees, other than the candidate's individual campaign depository, whose financial information is included, in whole or in part, in calculating an individual candidate's contribution and expenditure totals. This listing of supporting committees identifies the supporting committees included in a candidate's calculations in addition to his or her personal campaign fund. Each entry also identifies the percentage by which the supporting committees' transactions were prorated to the individual candidate. The individual candidate information summary sheets in Volume 2 contain a complete listing of each candidate's depositories.

Since the contributions and expenditures reflected for any candidate throughout this report represent a combination of financial activity transacted through multiple depositories, it is essential to understand the method applied in calculating a candidate's total campaign activity. This method of merging various depository information provides the most accurate overview of a candidate's entire campaign. The methodology used is described in the Introduction to Volume 1. Volume 2 of this report contains the individual candidate information summary sheets for each legislative candidate filing the detailed report, Form R-1, in the 1983 general election.

## SECTION II

### EXPENDITURES

#### INTRODUCTION

The election of the State's 201st Legislature in 1983 was the most expensive in New Jersey since the enactment of the Campaign Reporting Act in 1973 when detailed campaign financial disclosure began. Total expenditures in the 1983 legislative general election, including expenditures by the candidates and their supporting committees and by the two state political party committees, combined, were \$8,250,598. This was a three percent increase over the total combined expenditures in 1981 of \$7,988,847 but a 109 percent increase over the total expended in 1977 of \$3,945,814.

The 1983 legislative general election candidates themselves, along with their supporting committees, spent over \$5.5 million dollars in the 1983 general election. This figure represents a 28 percent increase over the \$4.3 million spent in the 1981 election by candidates and candidate-related committees and a 64 percent increase over the 1977 election when \$3.4 million was expended. On the other hand, in 1983, both state political party committees decreased their spending on behalf of legislative candidates by 25 percent from what they spent in 1981. While the state political party committees spent over \$3.6 million in 1981, they reduced their spending to \$2.7 million in 1983. This figure is still more than four to five times the \$592,464 the same committees spent in 1977 and the \$468,474 they spent in 1979. The table that follows compares expenditures in the 1981 and 1983 legislative general elections.

Expenditures by the 81 Senate candidates who filed the detailed report of contributions and expenditures, Form R-1, totalled \$2,843,558 (not including state political party expenditures) and averaged \$35,106 per candidate. In the Assembly, the 152 candidates who filed Form R-1 expended \$2,671,499 (not including state political party expenditures) for an average of \$17,576 per candidate.

Expenditure tables in this section provide information on the individual candidates, the legislative district, each house of the Legislature, and the Legislature as a whole. Tables 2.1 through 2.7 in this section summarize the expenditure information in two parts. The first part of each table is a summary of the candidates' campaign expenditures; these figures include expenditures from the candidates' campaign funds and all candidate-related committees that supported the candidates. These tables are labeled with an "a", i.e. Table 2.1a. The second part of each table, identified as "total expenditures," includes any targeted state political party committee expenditures on behalf of the candidates in addition to the expenditures by the candidates and candidate-related committees. Targeted expenditures are those expenditures made on behalf of a specific candidate by the candidate's state political party committee. These tables are labeled with a "b", i.e. Table 2.1b.

There are three expenditure tables comparing the 1983 general election and previous legislative elections (1981, 1979 and 1977). In these tables, the state political party committees' expenditures include those committees' targeted expenditures and their party building expenditures as well. The tables are 2.10, 2.11, and 2.12.

The methods used to assemble the data contained in this section are explained in the Introduction of this report. The reader is urged to read the methodology and its underlying assumptions before attempting to interpret this information.

#### SENATE AND ASSEMBLY CANDIDATE EXPENDITURES

Tables 2.1a and 2.1b summarize, by district, the dollar amount expended by all legislative candidates and include subtotals of expenditures by each political party's candidates. Tables 2.2a and 2.2b provide the same information for Senate candidates; Tables 2.3a and 2.3b provide the same information for Assembly candidates.

In 1983, nine races for Senate seats resulted in candidate campaign expenditures (not including targeted state political party committee allocations) in excess of \$100,000; four of the races resulted in expenditures in excess of \$200,000; see Table 2.4a. By way of comparison, in 1981, only three races exceeded \$100,000 in expenditures. However, the most expensive senatorial race since disclosure reports were first required in 1973 remains the 1981 District 2 Senate race between Senator Steven Perskie (D) and Joseph McGahn (R). Combined, those two candidates spent \$436,731. The most expensive Senate race in the 1983 general election was

the District 30 contest between Senator Carmen Orechio (D) and Ralph Salerno (R) in which campaign expenditures totalled \$298,023.

Tables 2.4a and 2.4b rank the Senate races in descending order by the amount of expenditures by district. Table 2.4a shows campaign expenditures only by the candidate and any candidate-related committees, while Table 2.4b includes state political party committee targeted expenditures. Both of the tables show that the Senate races in Districts 30 and 21 were the most expensive in 1983. However, the rankings of the other eight most expensive races varies between tables. Although the same ten districts rank in the top ten, the order of their ranking changes when the targeted state political party committee expenditures are added to the candidates' expenditures.

In the Assembly, there was also a similar increase from three in 1981 to nine in 1983 in the number of races exceeding \$100,000 (not including state political party expenditures). The \$258,561 spent by the five candidates and their supporting committees in the 1983 District 30 Assembly race made that contest the most expensive Assembly race since disclosure requirements began in 1973.

Tables 2.5a and 2.5b rank the Assembly districts by the amount of expenditures. Each Assembly table is identical to its counterpart in the Senate (Tables 2.4a and 2.4b). As in the Senate, District 30 was the most expensive Assembly race. However, Table 2.5b, which includes targeted state political party committee expenditures, reveals a major change in the most expensive races. Districts 14 and 13 rise from ninth and tenth, respectively, on Table 2.5a to second and third, respectively, on Table 2.5b, when state political party committee targeted expenditures are included in each district's total expenditures.

The races in 1983 for all of the legislative seats in the 30th District were the most expensive since disclosure requirements began in 1973. The \$556,584 spent by the 30th District Senate and Assembly candidates (not including the state political party allocations) exceeded the \$542,817 spent in 1981 by the candidates for legislative office in District 2. A much greater difference in expenditures between the 1983 election District 30 races and the 1981 election District 2 races results when the total campaign expenditures, including targeted expenditures by the state party committees, are compared. In 1983, over \$750,000 was expended in the race for the 30th District Senate and Assembly seats. This figure is more than \$200,000 over the total expenditures of \$542,817 for all legislative seats in District 2 in 1981.

In the 1983 Senate races, 21 candidates exceeded \$50,000 in campaign expenditures; six of these candidates exceeded \$100,000 in campaign expenditures; see Table 2.6a. When targeted state party committee expenditures are included in the expenditure totals, the number of candidates exceeding \$50,000 rises to 24, the number of candidates exceeding \$100,000 rises to 11, and two candidates exceed \$200,000; see Table 2.6b.

In the 1981 general election for Senate, only two candidates, Senator Perskie and Mr. McGahn (District 2), exceeded \$100,000 in expenditures. However, the \$243,599 spent by Mr. McGahn (R), District 2, in 1981 remains the largest amount spent by a candidate and his or her supporting committees in a general election Senate race. This amount also exceeds the total expenditures (targeted state committee expenditures included) of the Senate candidate in 1983, Senator Carmen Orechio (D) of District 30, whose total campaign expenditures of \$236,455 represented the most expensive Senate campaign in 1983; see Table 2.6b.

Tables 2.6a and 2.6b rank the individual Senate candidates in descending order by the amount spent on their candidacies. Table 2.6a shows expenditures by the candidate and his or her candidate-related committees; Table 2.6b includes the information on Table 2.6a plus the targeted state political party committee allocations to the candidates. The rankings change significantly when state committee expenditures are included. In Table 2.6a, Senator William Gormley (R) of District 2 is shown as spending the most and Senator Carmen Orechio (D) of District 30 ranks second. However, when targeted state political party committee expenditures are added, Senator Orechio moves to the top of the list and is followed by his challenger, Ralph Salerno (R), who was ranked sixth in Table 2.6a. With targeted state political party committee expenditures added to his own campaign expenditures, Senator Gormley drops to third on Table 2.6b.

Five candidates for the Assembly in 1983 exceeded \$50,000 in campaign expenditures (not including targeted state political party expenditures) with one of the five exceeding \$100,000; see Table 2.7a. However, when the targeted state political party committee expenditures are included, the number of candidates expending over \$50,000 increases to eleven and of those eleven, two exceeded \$100,000; see Table 2.7b. The \$102,695 spent by Assemblyman A.J. "Buddy" Fortunato (D) of District 30 is more than two and one-half times greater than the largest amount, \$38,569, spent by Assembly candidates Peter Marone and Assemblyman John Paul Doyle of District 10 in 1981. The amount spent by Assemblyman Fortunato also exceeds the previous highest expenditure total of \$50,999 by Jim Bildner (D) of the 25th District in the 1979 general election. Five other candidates also exceeded 1979-candidate Bildner's previously most expensive campaign, \$50,999, and fifteen exceeded the 1981 most expensive campaign, \$38,569.

Tables 2.7a and 2.7b rank the individual Assembly candidates by their campaign expenditures. Table 2.7a shows only expenditures by the candidate and candidate-related committees. Table 2.7b includes targeted state political party committee expenditures. As with the Senate, the rankings of individual candidates change notably between the two tables. The two candidates who spent the most are the same in both tables; however, the order in which they appear is reversed. In Table 2.7a, which includes only expenditures by the candidates and candidate-related committees, Assemblyman Fortunato is ranked first with Stephen Aduato, Jr. (D), also of District 30, ranked second. The ranking of these two candidates is

reversed in Table 2.7b with the inclusion of targeted state political party committee expenditures. Another difference shown in the two tables is the rankings of the Democratic candidates in District 13, with Jacqueline Walker and Assemblyman William Flynn moving from 25th and 61st, respectively, on Table 2.7a to 5th and 11th, respectively, in Table 2.7b when targeted state political party committee expenditures are included. Also, the Democratic candidates in District 14 also made a notable jump in ranking with the addition of targeted state political party committee expenditures. Assemblyman Joseph Bocchini, Jr. moved from 12th on Table 2.7a to 3rd on Table 2.7b, while his running mate, Assemblyman Joseph Paterno, moved from 21st to 7th when state political party committee expenditures are included.

In the 1983 legislative election, incumbents outspent the challengers. In the 40 Senate races, the incumbents averaged \$46,438 in campaign expenditures while the challengers averaged less than half of that, i.e. \$22,917. Incumbents in the 80 Assembly races averaged \$22,194, while their challengers averaged \$13,633. Table 2.8 shows the total expenditures and the average expenditure of incumbents and challengers within their respective parties.

#### STATE POLITICAL PARTY COMMITTEES' EXPENDITURES FOR LEGISLATIVE RACES

The Democratic and Republican State Committees' financial participation in the 1983 legislative races decreased by 25 percent from the committees' activity in the 1981 legislative election. In 1983, the state political party committees and their legislative campaign committees spent \$2.7 million on behalf of their respective Senate and Assembly candidates. Of this amount, the committees spent \$1.11 million on targeted expenditures and \$1.62 million on party building expenditures. In 1981, the committees expended \$3.6 million. Of this amount in 1981, the committees spent \$339,000 on targeted expenditures and \$3.32 million on party building activity.

For this analysis of the 1983 legislative general election, expenditures by the state political party committees have been separated into two categories. The first is general party building activities. These expenditures may be for organizational fund raising, the net proceeds of which may be used in a campaign setting; for institutional advertising; and for activity which promotes the party but not specific candidates. The second category is targeted campaign expenditures. These expenditures are paid for by the state political party committee and specifically targeted on behalf of a particular candidate or slate of candidates. Such expenditures are designed to promote directly one or more candidates rather than to support all of the party's candidates.

The Campaign Reporting Act requires political committees to allocate expenditures they make on behalf of the candidates benefitting from the transactions. Candidates acknowledge the dollar amount expended



on their behalf by including the entry as part of their disclosure reports. The amount is reported as part of the total campaign expenditures on behalf of a candidate's campaign.

In the 1981 general election, the state political party committees were required to allocate both categories of expenditures, general party building and targeted, plus any vendor activity that the state party committees may have undertaken on behalf of the candidates who, in turn, reimbursed the state party committees. This method caused a serious overstating of the actual 1981 campaign expenditures of both the candidates and the state party committees.

In 1983, the Commission revised its policy so that only those state political party committee expenditures directly benefitting candidates would be allocated to candidates. Party building expenditures and vendor activity were reported separately from campaign expenditures and not allocated to the candidates. The payments to the state political party committees by the candidates for vendor activity were reported as campaign expenses by the candidate and/or the candidate's supporting committees themselves. This revision in the way in which allocating state political party committee expenditures are allocated provides a more accurate accounting of actual campaign expenditures by the candidates and the state political party committees.

Although overall state political party committee spending was less in 1983 than in 1981, the amount of state political party committee targeted expenditures increased. In 1983, the Democratic State Committee and the Democratic Legislative Campaign Committee expended \$526,680 on targeted campaign expenditures. This change represented an increase of 180 percent over the \$188,102 the committee spent in the 1981 election. On the Republican side, the Republican State Committee, including the Governor's Ball and Vice Presidential Luncheon accounts, along with the Republican Legislative Campaign Committee, spent \$586,162 on targeted campaign activity in 1983. This spending represents a 288 percent increase over the \$150,996 spent in 1981.

While targeted expenditures by the state political party committees increased from 1981 to 1983, expenditures for party building activity decreased. In 1983, the Democrats expended \$269,265 for general party building activity. This figure represented an 80 percent decrease from 1981. The Republicans also spent less on party building activity in 1983 when they spent \$1,353,434; this amount was a decrease of 31 percent from the \$1,968,480 they spent in 1981. The average per legislative candidate spent by the state political party committees on party building activity declined from \$11,275 for the Democrats and \$16,404 for the Republicans in 1981 to \$2,244 for the Democrats and \$10,135 for the Republicans in 1983.

The national political party committees also decreased their participation in the 1983 general election. In the 1981 general election, the Democratic and Republican National Committees contributed \$124,555 and

\$835,297, respectively, to their state party committees. Of the Republican National Committee's contribution in 1981, \$656,291 represented in-kind services donated to the Republican State Committee. These in-kind contributions were attributed to the party building activity of the state party committee. In 1983, the national political party committee participation was reduced to a \$60,966 contribution from the Republican National Committee to the Republican State Committee. The Democratic National Committee made no contributions to the Democratic State Committee in the 1983 general election.

Table 2.9 lists the 16 Senate candidates and the 21 Assembly candidates who received targeted allocations of \$10,000 or more from their respective state political party committees. Of the 37 candidates who received such allocations, 21 were Republicans and 16 were Democrats. Of these 37 candidates, 18 were successful.

In the 1981 general election legislative races, there were only three candidates who received state political party committee allocations of \$10,000 or more, with the \$12,784 received by Senate candidate C. Louis Bassano (R-21) being the highest state political party committee allocation. In 1983, 34 candidates received state party committee allocations greater than the largest allocation in 1981. The largest state political party committee allocation in 1983 was \$106,652 spent on behalf of Senate candidate Ralph Salerno (R) of District 30, and Senator Joseph Hirkala (D) of the 36th District received the largest Democratic allocation, \$61,438; see Table 2.9. All 120 Republican candidates received a targeted amount from the Republican State Party, while only 34 out of 120 Democratic candidates received a targeted allocation from the Democratic State Party.

#### TOTAL EXPENDITURE INFORMATION AND COMPARISONS WITH PREVIOUS LEGISLATIVE ELECTIONS

The candidates, candidate-related committees, and state political party committees participating in the 1983 legislative election spent more money than any previous legislative election since the establishment of the Campaign Reporting Act in 1973. A total of \$8,250,598 was expended in the 1983 general election; this amount represents a three percent increase over the 1981 total of \$7,988,847. The increase in overall expenditures from 1981 to 1983 is not nearly as great as the increase from 1977 to 1981 (1977 was the year previous to 1981 when both houses of the Legislature were elected). Overall expenditures between 1977 and 1981 more than doubled. Tables 2.10, 2.11, and 2.12 show the cumulative expenditure totals of the entire Legislature and of each house separately for the past four legislative elections (1977, 1979, 1981 and 1983). The tables contain information on two types of expenditures. The first section of each table summarizes expenditures only by the candidates and candidate-related committees. The second section provides information on the state political party committee expenditures in the legislative races including both party building activity and targeted expenditures on behalf of specific candidates. The final section of each table reports the total expenditures

for the election by party. It is important to note that the offices contested in each of the four years are not the same. In 1983, both houses of the Legislature were contested; in 1981 and 1977, both houses of the Legislature and the office of Governor were contested; while in 1979, the entire Assembly but only two Senate seats were contested.

Overall, in 1983, the Republican legislative candidates and the Republican State Committee (includes party building activity) spent over \$1.1 million more than their Democratic counterparts. The same was the case in 1977 and 1981; the Democrats, in 1979, outspent Republicans by \$280,000. However, when the state political party committee expenditures are excluded from the expenditure totals and only candidate expenditures are considered, Democratic candidates have outspent the Republican candidates in every legislative election since 1977.

Total expenditures for Senate races, including state political party committee expenditures, increased by 18 percent from 1981 to 1983; see Table 2.11. The 81 Senate candidates who filed a detailed report, Form R-1, in 1983 spent nearly \$4 million as compared to the \$3.4 million spent in 1981 by the same number of candidates. Democratic Senate candidates' total campaign expenditures rose in 1983 by six percent over 1981, while Republican Senate candidates increased their total campaign expenditures by 29 percent. The largest percentage increase in total expenditures was by the non-party or Independent Senate candidates whose total expenditures increased by 43 percent, from \$23,159 in 1981 for the three candidates who expended \$1,000 or more, to \$33,044 for the same number of candidates in 1983.

Senate candidate campaign expenditures, not including state political party committee expenditures, increased from \$2,137,625 in 1981 to \$2,843,558 in 1983. This change represents a 33 percent increase over the 1981 legislative general election. Democratic Senate candidates' expenditures increased by 21 percent during this same period to \$1,329,803 in 1983. The \$1,480,711 spent by Republican Senate candidates represents a 46 percent increase over the amount spent in 1981.

Overall, Republican Senate candidates outspent their Democratic counterparts by over 30 percent when state political party committee expenditures are included; see Table 2.11. The average amount expended by the 40 Democratic Senate candidates and the Democratic State Committee was \$42,832, while the 38 Republican Senate candidates averaged \$58,183. (Note: Two Republican Senate candidates filed a Form A-1, Sworn Statement in lieu of reports, stating that their total campaign expenditures would not exceed \$1,000.) The difference in spending between Democrats and Republicans is less when state political party committee expenditures are excluded. The average for Democratic Senate candidates decreases to \$33,245, while the Republican average declines to \$38,966.

Assembly candidates' total expenditures, including state political party committee expenditures, party building and targeted, decreased by approximately \$350,000 in 1983. The 152 candidates who filed

a detailed report, Form R-1, spent \$4.25 million in 1983 as compared to the \$4.6 million in the 1981 legislative general election by the same number of candidates. The Assembly candidates of both political parties showed a decrease in total expenditures from 1981 to 1983. The Democratic Assembly candidates spent 13 percent less while the Republican Assembly candidates' total campaign expenditures decreased by 4 percent. This decrease in total campaign expenditures can be explained by the decrease in state political party committee expenditures.

Although combined total expenditures by both Assembly candidates and the state political party committees declined between 1981 and 1983, spending by just the Assembly candidates and their candidate-related committees increased by 22 percent; see Table 2.12. Assembly candidate campaign expenditures increased to \$2,671,499 in 1983 from \$2,185,664 in 1981. Democratic Assembly candidates increased their campaign expenditures by 30 percent to \$1,430,574 from what they spent in 1981. However, this total is still less than the \$1,442,625 spent by the Democratic Assembly candidates in the 1979 legislative general election. The \$12,000 difference may possibly be explained by the number of candidates filing detailed reports. In 1979, there were 80 Democratic Assembly candidates filing detailed reports while in 1983 there were 78. Another possible explanation for the decrease is the one offered by the Commission in its report on the 1981 legislative election. In that report, the Commission suggested that there may be an economy of scale in the campaigns. In 1983, each party fielded three candidates in every legislative district, while, in 1979, only the Assembly was up for election and each party fielded two candidates in each district. There may be a savings in the overall cost of a campaign when three candidates rather than two share the campaign costs.

Republican Assembly candidates increased their campaign expenditures to \$1,228,137 in 1983 which represents a 13 percent increase over the \$1,088,993 spent in the 1981 election; see Table 2.12.

As in the Senate races, the Republican Assembly candidates outspent their Democratic opponents by 29 percent when state party committee expenditures are included in the expenditure totals. The 73 Republican Assembly candidates averaged \$31,460 in total campaign expenditures while the Democratic Assembly candidates averaged \$23,735 per candidate. (Note: Three Democratic and seven Republican candidates filed a Form A-1, Sworn Statement in lieu of reports, stating that their total campaign expenditures would not exceed \$1,000.) However, if state political party committee expenditures are not included, the Democratic Assembly candidates outspent their Republican counterparts by \$202,000. The Democratic Assembly candidates averaged \$18,579 while their Republican opponents averaged \$16,824; see Table 2.12.

Tables 2.13 and 2.14 compare the amount of campaign expenditures (not including state political party committee expenditures) by those who won and lost within each party in the 1981 and 1983 elections. The average spent by successful 1983 Senate candidates was \$44,165; this amount is almost \$18,000 more than the unsuccessful candidates; see Table 2.13.

Spending by winning candidates accounted for 62 percent of the total expended by Senate candidates. Winning Republican Senate candidates on average spent \$20,000 more per candidate than the winning Democratic candidates. The 17 successful Republican Senate candidates averaged \$55,973 while the 23 successful Democratic Senate candidates averaged \$35,437. Among the unsuccessful Senate candidates, the 17 Democrats averaged \$30,280 while the 21 Republicans averaged \$25,198.

In the Assembly races, the 80 successful candidates averaged \$22,530 in campaign expenditures (not including state political party committee expenditures) while the 72 unsuccessful candidates' average campaign expenditures were \$12,071. Winning candidates accounted for 67 percent of the total campaign expenditures in the Assembly races. The 36 successful Republican Assembly candidates averaged \$24,177 in campaign expenditures, while the 44 Democratic winners averaged \$21,182. Among the unsuccessful Assembly candidates, the 37 unsuccessful Republicans averaged \$9,669 while the 33 Democrats who were unsuccessful averaged \$15,108.

### SECTION III

#### SUMMARY AND ANALYSIS OF CONTRIBUTIONS AND RECEIPTS

This section provides summary contribution and receipt information for the 233 legislative candidates who filed detailed reports, Form R-1, in the 1983 general election. The information has been organized by party (Democratic and Republican), by legislative house for which the candidates ran (Senate and Assembly), by those who won and those who lost, and by the candidate's incumbency status. In addition, contribution and receipt summaries are included for the two state political party committees (including their special statewide 1983 general election accounts), both of which played prominent roles in the 1983 legislative election. Section IV of this report provides detailed information on contributions made by political action committees. Moreover, Section V of this report provides lists of major contributors to legislative candidates and to the two state political party committees and their special statewide general election accounts.

Tables in this section have been prepared from the individual candidate information summary sheets which are found in Volume 2 of this report. The methodology used in accumulating these figures is explained in the introduction of this volume. The reader is urged to review the methodology and underlying assumptions before referring to the tables in this report.

From the figures calculated for each individual candidate, one can determine, for example, the extent to which a candidate received his or her support from the candidate's personal funds, individuals, businesses, the candidate's political party committee, other political committees, business PACs, union PACs, other PACs, or unions. Other analyses can be done using the information on the amount of contributions and by the type of receipt, i.e. itemized contributions, unitemized contributions of \$100 or less, prior election transfers, loans, and state political party allocations. In this section, the individual candidate information has been aggregated into summaries to permit the reader to make similar analyses and comparisons among the types of candidates, for example, Democratic and Republican candidates, Senate and Assembly candidates, incumbents and nonincumbents, and candidates who won and candidates who lost.

All of the tables which follow the text of this section are organized in the same manner and parallel the information displayed on the individual candidate sheets found in Volume 2. The first portion of each table provides information on contributions by type of contributor including the candidate's own funds and funds from other individuals, businesses, political party committees, other political committees, unions, and different types of PACs. The second portion of each table displays information on contributions by dollar amount. In these two portions of the tables, information is provided on the number and dollar value of the contributions, the percentage of each to the total, and the average contribution. The third portion of each table provides information on the amount of receipts by type of receipt and the percentage of each to the total receipts.

In total, all legislative candidates received over \$6.1 million in contributions through the 15-day postelection report which covers activity through November 22, 1983. The total receipts available to all legislative candidates amounted to \$8.4 million, made up of the \$6.1 million in contributions, nearly \$800,000 in prior election transfers, nearly \$240,000 in loans outstanding, and \$1.26 million in allocations from the two state political

party committees. The two state political party committees received contributions of nearly \$3.6 million (Democratic statewide committees - \$1.1 million and Republican statewide committee - \$2.5 million). Since both state political party committees spent much of their money on behalf of legislative candidates, information on their contributors has been included.

What follows is an analysis of the "significant" differences, if any, which appear from various comparisons of categories of candidates. For this analysis, "significant" has been defined as a 10 or more percentage point difference in any category of contributor, contribution, or receipt. For example, if winning candidates received 20 percent of their funds from individuals, and losing candidates received 80 percent of their funds from individuals, that 60 percentage point difference would be deemed "significant."

#### COMPARISON BETWEEN DEMOCRATS AND REPUBLICANS

The 117 Democratic legislative candidates received a total of nearly \$3.2 million in contributions or an average \$27,034.35 and the 111 Republican candidates received \$2.9 million or an average of \$26,188.26. The 117 Democratic candidates had total receipts in excess of \$4.2 million or an average of \$36,271.85 while their 111 Republican opponents had total receipts of nearly \$4.1 million or an average of \$36,738.41. (Note: There were five independent candidates who filed detailed reports, Form R-1, but for whom detailed analyses were not prepared. Thus, the total number of candidates (128) in this analysis by party affiliation (117 Democrats and 111 Republicans) is five less than the total of 233 candidates in the other analyses in this section.)

The patterns of contributors to and receipts of Democratic and Republican candidates in the 1983 general election were generally similar. However, there were two "significant" differences. The Republican candidates received 24.7 percent of their contributions from political party committees while Democratic candidates received 9.2 percent of their contributions from such committees, a 14.5 percentage point difference. The other "significant" difference was in the number of itemized contributions of \$100 or less. For the Republican candidates, such contributions represented 44.3 percent of the total number of itemized contributions, while for the Democratic candidates, they represented 30.8 percent, or a 13.5 percentage point difference; see Table 3.2 Comparison of Contributions and Receipts to Legislative Candidates by Party Affiliation - 1983 General Election.

#### COMPARISON BETWEEN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY CANDIDATES

The 81 Senate candidates who filed detailed disclosure reports received a total of \$3.0 million, or an average of \$37,391.53, and the 152 Assembly candidates who filed detailed reports received a total of \$3.1 million, or an average of \$20,322.87. There were no "significant" differences in the patterns of contributors to and receipts of Senate and Assembly candidates other than the number of itemized contributions of \$100 or less and contributions of \$101-250. Itemized contributions of \$100 or less represented a significantly larger portion of Assembly candidates' contributions, 46.6 percent, in comparison to Senate candidates' contributions, 25.4 percent. Contributions of \$101-\$250 represented a significantly smaller portion of Assembly candidates' itemized contributions, 29.9 percent, in comparison to Senate candidates' itemized contributions, 42.2 percent. The differences are due probably to the

way in which contributions to Assembly candidates were calculated and the fact that many Assembly candidates ran in teams. Thus, a contribution of \$150 to two Assembly candidates running as a team was counted as two separate contributions of \$75 each while a similar \$150 contribution to a Senate candidate was counted as one contribution of \$150. For a more detailed explanation of the methodology used in assembling the data for this report, please see the Introduction; see Table 3.3 Comparison of Contributions and Receipts to Senate and Assembly Legislative candidates - 1983 General Election.

#### COMPARISON BETWEEN WINNERS AND LOSERS

The 120 candidates who won received \$4.1 million in contributions or an average of \$34,086.82 while the 133 candidates who lost received \$2.0 million or an average of \$15,243.40. The candidates who won had total receipts of \$5.6 million or an average of \$46,305.43. The unsuccessful candidates had total receipts of \$2.8 million or an average of \$21,168.56. The principal "significant" difference between contributions to those who won and to those who lost is in contributions from "business PACs" which gave significantly more contributions and more money to winners than to those who lost the election. Business PACs represented 24.6 percent of the contributors to winning candidates but only 7.5 percent to losing candidates, a 17.1 percentage point difference. As a percentage of total contributions, business PACs provided winners with 27.6 percent of their money while providing losing candidates with only 10.4 percent of their money, a 17.2 percentage point difference. In absolute numbers, there were 2,250 business PAC contributions totaling \$916,556 to winners while there were only 372 business PAC contributions of \$160,609 to candidates who lost.

Another "significant" difference between successful and unsuccessful candidates in the 1983 legislative general election was in the number of contributions from individuals. Such contributors represented 35.6 percent of the number of contributions to winning candidates while representing 45.6 to unsuccessful candidates, a 10 percentage point difference. A third "significant" difference was in the number of itemized contributions of \$100 or less which represented 32.8 percent of the number of contributions to winning candidates while representing 45.6 percent to candidates who lost, or a 12.8 percentage point difference. Finally, successful candidates received 12.4 percent of their total receipts from leftover funds from prior elections while unsuccessful candidates received 2.5 percent of their total receipts from prior election transfers, a 9.9 percentage point difference. The probable explanation for this "significant" difference is that most incumbents who sought re-election were also successful and it is more likely that incumbents had funds left over from prior elections; see Table 3.4, Comparison of Contributions and Receipts to Winning and Losing Legislative Candidates - 1983 General Election.

#### COMPARISON BY INCUMBENCY STATUS

The 111 incumbents, including members of the Assembly running for the Senate and an incumbent Senator running for an Assembly seat, received nearly \$4.0 million or an average of \$35,964.45 and the 122 nonincumbents received \$2.1 million in contributions or an average of \$17,424.07. Receipts for incumbents totaled \$5.3 million or an average of \$48,242.63 while nonincumbents had total receipts of \$3.0 million or an average of \$24,730.64. The patterns of contributions and receipts to incumbents and nonincumbents were very similar,

with only one "significant" difference. That difference was business PACs which represented 24.3 percent of the contributors to incumbents while representing only 7.1 percent of the contributors to nonincumbents, a 17.2 percentage point difference. The money such PACs contributed to incumbent candidates represented 28.8 percent of all contributions to incumbents but only 8.4 percent of all contributions to nonincumbents, a difference of 20.4 percentage points. (See Table 3.5, Comparison of Contributions and Receipts to Legislative Candidates by Incumbency Status - 1983 General Election.)

#### COMPARISON OF CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE STATE POLITICAL PARTY COMMITTEES

In the 1983 general election, there were three Democratic political party committees participating in the legislative election, namely: the Democratic State Committee's operating account, that Committee's Legislative Victory Fund, and the 1983 Democratic Legislative Campaign Committee. For the Republicans, there were five such committees, namely: the Republican State Committee's operating account, that Committee's campaign account, the Governor's Ball, the Vice Presidential Luncheon, and the Republican Legislative Campaign Committee. In preparing this analysis of contributions and receipts of the state political party committees, the contributions and receipts for the two sets of committees, Democratic and Republican, were merged.

Contributions to the Democratic State Committees participating in the 1983 general election totaled \$1.1 million. The statewide Republican committees participating in the 1983 general election received a total of \$2.5 million in contributions of which \$60,966 was from the Republican National Committee. The statewide Democratic committees had total receipts of \$1.2 million while the Republican committees had total receipts of \$2.8 million.

The comparison of contributors to and receipts of the statewide Democratic and Republican committees participating in the 1983 general election showed six "significant" differences. The first is in the number of contributions from individuals. Such contributions represented 42.6 percent of the number of contributions to the statewide Democratic committees while representing 54.5 percent of the number of contributions to the statewide Republican committees, an 11.9 percentage point difference. The next "significant" difference was in the amount of contributions from businesses. Such contributions represented 17.0 percent of all itemized contributions for the statewide Democratic committees and 45.9 percent for the statewide Republican committees, a 28.9 percentage point difference.

The third "significant" difference was in both the number and amount of itemized contributions from other political committees. For the statewide Democratic committees, such contributions represented 16.5 percent of the number of itemized contributions and 48.4 percent of the amount of itemized contributions. The percentages of the statewide Republican committees for itemized contributions from other political committees were 4.5 percent of the number of itemized contributions and 15.3 percent of the amount of contributions. The differences were 12 percentage points for number of itemized contributions and 33.1 points for amount of itemized contributions.

The fourth "significant" difference was in the number of contributions in the range of \$101-\$250. For the statewide Democratic committees, the



percentage was 41.2 percent and for the statewide Republican committees 18.3 percent, or a 22.9 percentage point difference.

The fifth "significant" difference was in the number and amount of contributions in the range of \$1,000-\$2,500. Such contributions represented 14.6 percent of the number of itemized contributions and 13.6 percent of the amount of itemized contributions for the statewide Democratic committees. The comparable percentages for the statewide Republican committees were 36.8 percent and 25.4 percent. The differences were 22.2 percentage points for the number of contributions and 11.8 percentage points for the amount of contributions.

The final "significant" difference was that the statewide Democratic committees had no receipts from prior elections while the statewide Republican committees' prior election transfers represented 10.8 percent of the Republican committees' total receipts.

## SECTION IV

### POLITICAL ACTION COMMITTEES

Political Action Committee contributions in the 1983 legislative general election increased by nearly 50 percent over the amount contributed in the 1981 legislative election. In total, 112 PACs reported contributing \$1,675,629 to legislative candidates, candidate-related committees, state political party committees, and other statewide committees. Contributions (monetary and in-kind) to Senate and Assembly candidates and their supporting committees accounted for \$1,468,179 of the total contributed; this figure represents a 61 percent increase over the amount contributed in the 1981 election. PACs contributed an additional \$207,450 to the two state political party committees and other statewide committees; this figure represents an 11 percent decrease from the amount contributed in the 1981 legislative general election.

The decrease in PAC contributions to state political party committees is highlighted by excluding contributions to non-party committees. In the 1981 election, PACs contributed \$232,850 to the state political party committees; in 1983 the amount contributed to the state political party committees decreased by 19 percent to \$188,100. PACs contributed an additional \$19,350 to two statewide committees: Friends of Alan Karcher and The Governor's Club.

Seventy Senate candidates received \$703,287 while 128 Assembly candidates received \$764,892 from the PACs. The remaining 18 Senate candidates and 44 Assembly candidates received no contributions from PACs.

PACs reported making over 80 percent of their contributions to incumbent legislators. Challengers received only \$267,235 from PACs while the incumbent candidates received \$1,200,944. Each incumbent received at least \$1,900 from PACs while 62 out of 148 challengers received no PAC contributions. The average total amount received by incumbents was \$10,819 while challengers received an average of \$1,805 in PAC contributions.

Winners also received over 80 percent of the PAC funds as compared to less than 20 percent for those who lost. Winners received \$1,194,692 while those who lost received \$273,487. All successful candidates received at least \$1,800 from PACs. The average amount contributed to winning Senate candidates was \$13,179, while the successful Assembly candidates averaged \$8,344 from PACs. Unsuccessful Senate candidates received an average of \$3,669 from PACs and unsuccessful Assembly candidates received an average of \$1,058.

PACs reported contributing \$790,224 to 111 Democratic candidates and \$677,605 to 85 Republican candidates. Two Independent candidates received a total of \$350.

New Jersey, unlike the federal government, has no registration requirement for political committees. In 1979, the Commission adopted regulations clarifying the preelection filing requirement of political action committees; see N.J.A.C. 19:25-4.8. In January 1984, the Campaign Reporting Act was amended so that most PACs (excluding those groups which expend less than \$2,500 in a year) are now considered Continuing Political Committees. This type of committee must file quarterly reports of their financial activity with the Commission. The number of PACs submitting financial reports for the legislative general election has increased from 30 in 1979, to 81 in 1981, and 112 in 1983.



Table 4.1 in this section identifies the committees by full name and mailing address, the acronym by which they frequently identify themselves, and the treasurer's name and telephone number.

Under New Jersey law, nearly all of these groups on whose behalf a PAC has been organized could make political contributions directly from their general treasury; the exceptions are regulated industries, including banks, insurance companies, public utilities, and cable television corporations; see N.J.S.A. 19:34-32, 19:34-45. Furthermore, casinos and many casino employees are also prohibited from making any political contributions; see N.J.S.A. 5:12-138.

The 1983 legislative election was the first election where a PAC contributed more than \$100,000 to legislative candidates, state political party committees, and statewide committees. Two PACs, Builders PAC (\$179,671) and NJ Dental PAC (\$103,300), contributed more than \$100,000, and a third PAC, NJ Education Association PAC, contributed \$99,603. Table 4.2 ranks in descending order the 112 PACs by the amount contributed to the legislative election. The amount they contributed to each house of the legislature and to statewide committees is identified, as well as the total amount contributed in the legislative election.

Tables 4.3 and 4.4 rank in descending order the individual Senate and Assembly candidates by the amount of contributions that PACs reported making to them. The number of candidates receiving more than \$10,000 in PAC contributions increased from 17 in 1981 to 51 in 1983. Twelve Senate candidates in 1983 received more PAC money than the top Senate candidate, Francis Herbert (D-39) who received \$17,775, in the 1981 legislative election from PACS. In the Assembly, five candidates received more PAC money than the top recipient in 1981, Dean Gallo (R-26), \$16,648.

In Table 4.3, the top ten recipients in the 1983 legislative general election Senate races all exceeded \$20,000 while in 1981 no candidates received that amount. Of the top ten in the Senate, three lost their respective elections, including the top recipient, Ralph Salerno (R-30), who received \$38,946 from PACs. In 1981, two of the top ten lost, including the top PAC recipient, Francis Herbert (D-39).

In Table 4.4, three candidates exceeded \$20,000 in the 1983 legislative general election Assembly races while no candidates exceeded that amount in 1981. The top PAC recipient was Assemblyman John Paul Doyle (D-10) with \$25,113 in PAC contributions. In 1983, two of the top ten Assembly candidates lost their respective races, while in 1981 only one of the top ten was unsuccessful.

Table 4.5 identifies the amount that each PAC, which contributed over \$2,000 in the election, gave to each legislative candidate or statewide committee. The table is divided in three sections: the first two sections contain Senate candidates and Assembly candidates who received at least one PAC contribution and the third section contains statewide committees which received at least one contribution.

Those PACs that participated in the election but contributed \$2,000 or less are identified on Table 4.6; those candidates who did not receive any PAC contributions are identified on Table 4.7.

The number of "large" contributions to legislative candidates increased significantly over the 1981 legislative election. ("Large" is defined as more than \$1,000.) PACs reported making 171 contributions of more than \$1,000 during the 1983 legislative election. This figure represents a 120 percent increase over the 1981 election when 77 such contributions were made. In the 1981 election, the largest contribution made to a legislative candidate was \$7,000. This contribution was made by NJ Dental PAC to Senate candidate Gerald Cardinale (R-39). The largest contribution in the 1983 legislative election was given by Builders PAC to Senate candidate Ralph Salerno (R-30). Builders PAC's contributions to Mr. Salerno totaled \$29,296.

It is important to note that the information presented in this section is based on the disbursement information reported by the political action committees themselves. All contributions reported were made within the time frame of the 1983 general election activity. They include contributions made during the summer of 1983 that were reported in some committees' 60-day postelection primary election reports. Nevertheless, a candidate is not obligated to use the funds for the general election. For example, a legislative candidate with debts outstanding for the primary election could properly deposit the PAC contribution into his or her separate, segregated primary depository and report the receipt on the next subsequent 60-day reporting cycle for the primary election. Also, a candidate may make an undeposited transfer by endorsing the check over to another campaign depository which would then report the receipt within the context of its own report. Therefore, it is possible for differences to exist between this list of contributions as reported by the PAC contributor and the contribution information reported by the candidate.

## SECTION V

### DETAILED CONTRIBUTOR LISTINGS

The Campaign Reporting Act requires candidates and political committees participating in an election to identify the full name and mailing address of all contributors of more than \$100 in the aggregate. These are termed "itemized contributions."

Legislative candidates in the 1983 general election received 14,078 itemized contributions which accounted for nearly \$4.9 million of their campaign funds. The statewide Democratic and Republican committees participating in the legislative election reported another 1,845 itemized contributions totaling an additional \$3.3 million.

The median contribution for both Senate candidates and Assembly candidates fell within the \$101-\$250 range. For the Senate candidates, 42.2 percent of the contributions and, for the Assembly candidates, 29.9 percent of the contributions fell within that range. Yet, it was the amount of money received in contributions of \$1,000 or more which comprised nearly half (49.7 percent for Senate candidates and 46.5 percent for Assembly candidates) of all funds reported as itemized campaign contributions by the candidates and candidate-related committees. Of all itemized contributions received by candidates and their committees, the average itemized contribution was \$346.01.

For the statewide Democratic committees participating in the 1983 general election, the median contribution fell in the range of \$251 - \$500. For the statewide Republican committees, the median was in the range of \$1,000 - \$2,500. Both sets of committees received a majority of their itemized contributions in amounts of \$2,500 or more. In the case of the statewide Democratic committees, 66.3 percent of their itemized contributions were in amounts exceeding \$2,500. For the statewide Republican committees, the percentage was 72.7. The average contribution to statewide Democratic committees was \$1,615.97 and, to the statewide Republican committees, it was \$1,837.30.

Thus, contributions of \$1,000 or more to candidates and \$2,500 or more to statewide political party committees participating in the 1983 legislative general election represent an important factor in the amount of funds raised for legislative elections. For this reason, this section of the 1983 legislative general election report identifies those contributors of \$1,000 or more to legislative candidates in a detailed listing of contributors; see Table 5.1 Senate and Table 5.2 Assembly. As with all of the candidate contribution data contained in this report, multiple contributions from one contributor to a candidate's campaign fund and to his or her supporting committees are combined. For example, if John Smith contributed \$600 to candidate Jones' campaign fund and an additional \$500 to the Citizens to Elect Jones, then John Smith appears as a contributor of \$1,100 to candidate Jones. (Please refer to either the candidate's individual financial summary information sheet in Volume 2 or Section I, General Candidate Information, Table 1.10, for a list of a candidate's supporting committees.)

For the statewide Democratic and Republican committees, the largest dollar amounts of itemized contributions are those contributions received in amounts in excess of \$2,500. The Democrats received 74 such contributions totaling \$697,662. The Republicans reported 196 such contributions totaling \$1,525,029. The total amount of funds received in contribution amounts of more than \$2,500 represents 72.7 and 66.3 percent of the statewide Democratic and statewide Republican committees' itemized contributions, respectively. Tables 5.3 (Democrats) and 5.4 (Republicans) identify the contributors of \$2,500 or more to those committees.

A third group of contributors to the 1983 legislative elections that appear to represent a noteworthy factor are those who contributed to more than one candidate. If no one candidate received \$1,000 from such a contributor, the contributing entity would not appear on Table 5.1 Senate or Table 5.2 Assembly of this section. However, 104 individuals, 206 businesses, and 13 union categories made contributions of \$2,500 or more, in the aggregate, to the legislative races in the 1983 general election. Hence, Tables 5.5, 5.6, 5.7, and 5.8 identify individuals, businesses, union categories, and miscellaneous groups as contributors to various legislative campaigns. Please note that Tables 5.5 through 5.8 may repeat certain contributors from the list of contributors of \$1,000 or more to individual legislative candidates.

More importantly, these aggregate contribution lists may differ in identifying the recipients of contributions because of the formula used to aggregate contributions to a candidate's campaign fund and his or her supporting committees. (Please refer to the Introduction for a detailed description of this formula.) For example, John Smith contributes \$500 to candidate Jones' campaign fund. John Smith also contributes \$2,000 to candidate Jones' supporting committee, Citizens for Legislative Integrity, which supports candidate Jones on a 50 percent basis. In Table 5.1 in this section, John Smith appears as a contributor to candidate Jones in the aggregate amount of \$1,500. However, on Table 5.5, John Smith is listed as a contributor of a total amount of \$2,500; the contribution recipients are candidate Jones (\$500) and Citizens for Legislative Integrity (\$2,000). Both listings are accurate. Please remember that an individual candidate's total campaign activity has been calculated to represent not only those transactions through his or her own campaign fund, but also a portion of all transactions through any of the candidate's supporting committees based on the percentage of the candidate's share of expenditures allocated to all candidates. Merging of such activity (all of which was done manually by the ELEC staff) was essential to provide an accurate overview of all campaign activity when a candidate is being supported through more than one campaign depository.

Table 5.7 presents contributions to multiple campaigns by unions and union-affiliated associations. Some of these organizations are discussed in Section IV, Political Action Committees, of this report. However, as explained in that section, under New Jersey law, unions are not required to establish a separate political action committee in order to contribute to political campaigns in New Jersey. This report aggregated only those contributions for which the reporting entity or entities listed the same name and address. Therefore, the contributions from a union contributing from its general treasury account and also from its political action committee account would not necessarily be merged, unless the contributing organization made some indication to the Commission that the contributor and/or the controlling entities of the two

funds were one and the same. A similar situation exists with contributions from various local union affiliates of the same union. Therefore, Table 5.7 groups similar union and union association contributors by trade, skill, or type of employer. It also identifies a contributor's name and city, as reported by the receiving entity, to whom the contribution was made, and the contribution amount. Each subsection is totaled by dollar amount. A grand total identifies the amount of contributions reported as being received from all union and union associations for the 1983 legislative races. Those entries with an asterisk do not include detailed recipients because this information is provided in Section IV of this report. Please refer to the candidate/committee matrix (Table 4.5) in Section IV for this detailed information.
